



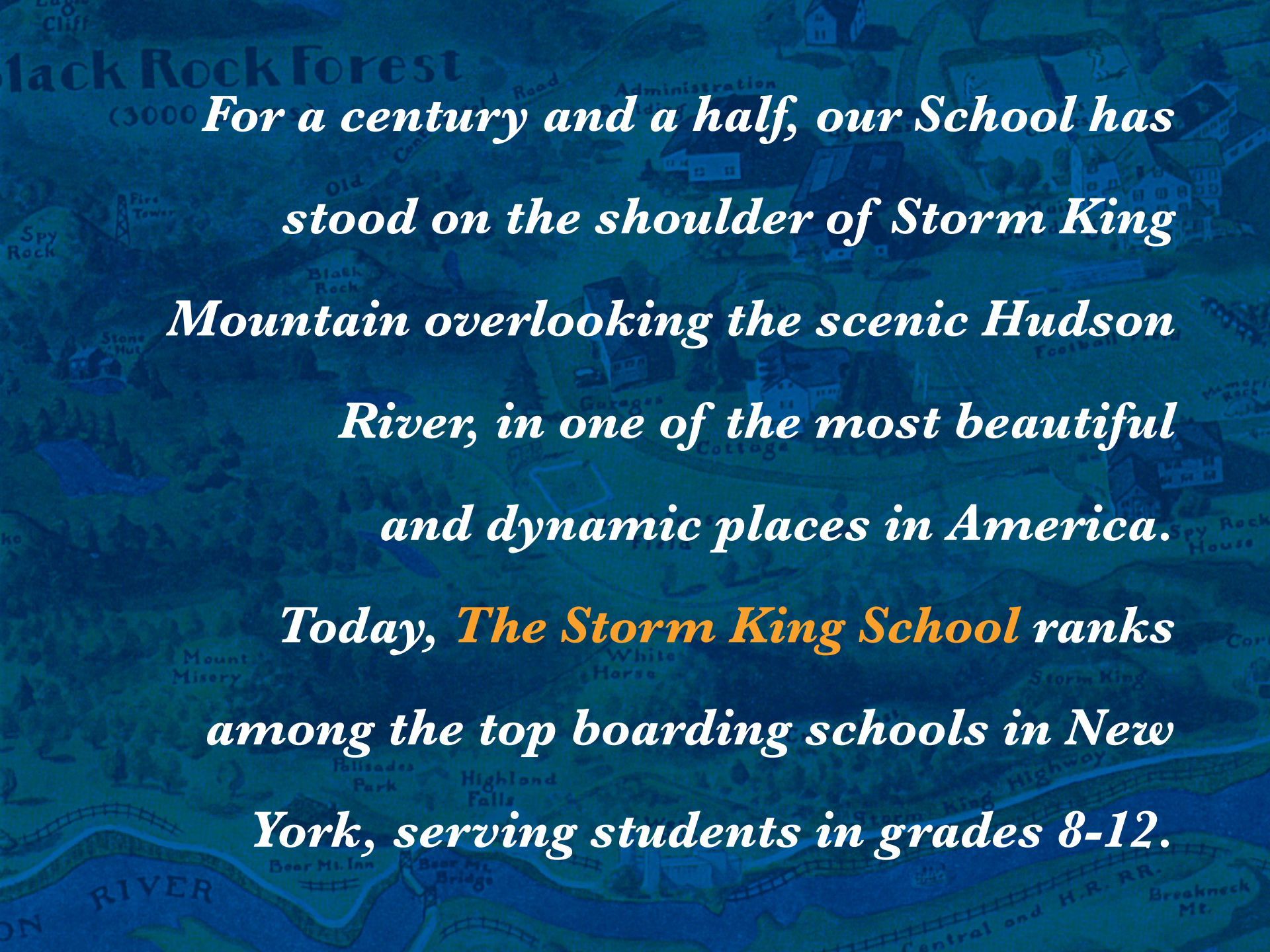

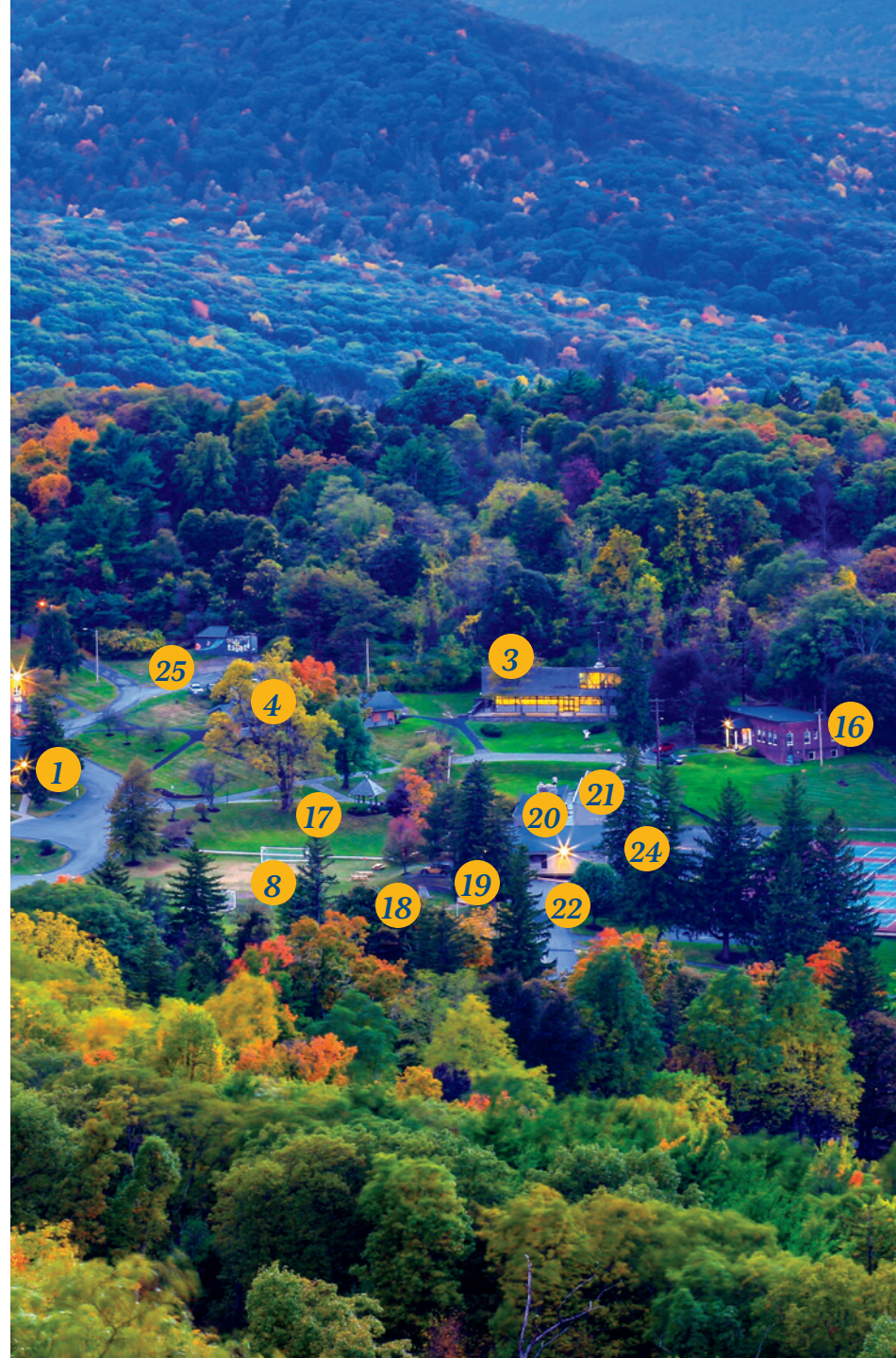

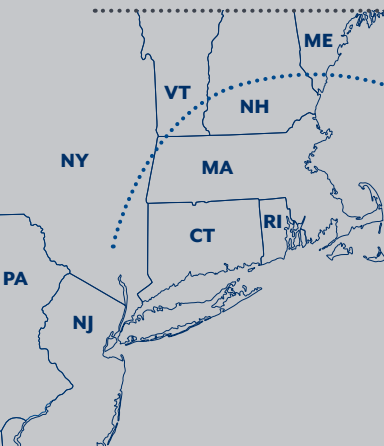

The Storm King School is located in New York's beautiful Hudson Valley in the quiet riverfront village of Cornwall-on-Hudson. With stunning mountaintop views overlooking the Hudson River, the area is a popular tourist destination for world-renowned arts and culture and its spectacular setting, including the 4,000-acre Black Rock Forest, which is adjacent to campus.

New York City is only 50 miles (80 km) away and accessible by train and car. Major airports with easy access to Storm King include JFK (1.5 hrs.), Newark (1 hr.), LaGuardia (1.5 hrs.) or nearby Stewart International (10 minutes away).

Inspiring Teachers, Coaches, and Mentors

EXCEPTIONAL EDUCATORS

Our faculty members are passionate about what they do, and masters of their content areas. They carefully design curriculum to push each student to their maximum potential, while expanding their educational opportunities both in and out of the classroom, preparing them for a world driven by exponential change.

The majority of our faculty members have chosen not only to teach at Storm King, but also to call Storm King their home. Some 65 percent of teachers and staff live on campus, and those who don't live on-site still share meals with students, coach sports teams, lead co-curricular activities, and build relationships with their students that extend beyond the classroom.

Our School community fosters a unique connection between students and teachers, making learning less of an academic pursuit and more a part of real life. Discussions that begin during class continue in the dining hall, on the playing field, and in the dormitory. Because Storm King teachers come to know the whole person, not just the student they see in class, they are able to advise students on a more personal level. Students, in turn, see their teachers as adults they can trust, not just the people who administer their tests.

Dr. Paul Feffer has always been passionate about learning. As a boy, his father, a professor of orthopedic surgery, brought home real mercury (you know, the toxic stuff), so that his son could make a barometer. Later, inspired by Carl Sagan's television series *Cosmos*, he took an interest in the skies and picked up rocketry. While in high school, he had a summer job working for an architect creating a scale model of a hotel. Subsequently, he taught himself to program computer software at the dawn of Apple and Microsoft, when very few knew how to use a computer—and even fewer knew how to teach programming.

When you walk into one of Dr. Feffer's classes at Storm King, you can feel his passion for learning and natural curiosity, and you can see how he conveys this to his students.

YOUR PATH TO SUCCESS

Our world is changing at a rapid pace and today's students must prepare for jobs that do not yet exist, in fields that have not yet been imagined. To ensure that Storm King students graduate with a competitive edge, ready and eager to thrive in the 21st-century economy, we help them become thinkers, doers, problem solvers, and adapters. We emphasize **CREATIVITY**, **COLLABORATION**, **CRITICAL THINKING**, and **COMMUNICATION** throughout our curriculum. With approximately 100 courses, including AP and Honors level subjects, Storm King students have the opportunity to design a schedule that allows them to explore their particular interests and passions.

Our academic program follows a university-style curriculum. The same four periods meet every day, and students take three to four courses in a given semester. With eight periods offered over the course of an academic year, students engage in more classes than they would at most other prep schools. By refocusing education on the principal of teacher-student interaction, the SKS Model reinforces our commitment to offering an experience that is specifically tailored to each student.

SIGNATURE PROGRAMS ▼

THE CAPSTONE PROJECT is a large-scale research assignment in which students synthesize learning from other courses and demonstrate their command of S.K.S. (Skills for Knowledge and Success) in a real-world context. Capstone Projects may be completed within one academic year, or may carry over into succeeding years. Strategic reading, writing, research, problem solving, technological proficiency, collaboration, and oral presentation skills are emphasized in each project.

THE Q-TERMS are short, intensive courses that provide faculty and students a chance to explore more deeply subject matter for which they have a particular passion and curiosity. Students meet with the same class and instructors every day and pursue only the subject related to their Q-Term. Such focus creates an arena for project-based learning, creative design, and service opportunities that enrich and deepen students' connection to the content.

Residential Life

HOME AWAY FROM HOME

The Storm King School is a true boarding school. About 70 percent of our students live on campus. The residential experience at Storm King educates the whole student and builds a healthy community through evening and weekend activities including service-learning opportunities, outdoor adventures, and cultural excursions. Dorm life is kept vibrant by our student activities committee, who frequently organizes pizza study breaks, dances, concerts, and much more.

...and yes, New York is so close! A commuter rail station is a short drive away from campus, and the Metro North train connects to Grand Central Station in less than an hour. What this means is that our students have easy access to world-class culture, universities, restaurants, and more.

DORMITORIES

More than 130 of our students live on campus. The smallest dorm has 10 students, and our largest has 40. We have 4 dormitories for boys and 2 for girls. The majority of our dorm rooms are arranged for double occupancy, although we do have a few singles and triples available. Some dorms, like Spy Rock and Cottage, are charming chalets and others are handsome brick buildings; all of them house faculty dorm parents and student RAs, comfy common room areas with fireplaces, TVs, and friends.

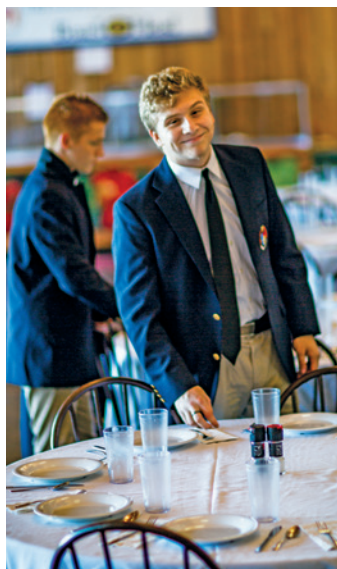
