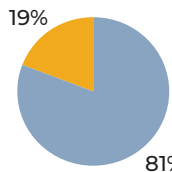
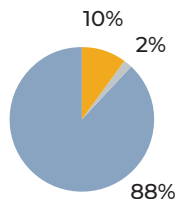
### SINGLE-GENDER MODEL

- 2% Military or Other Career Path

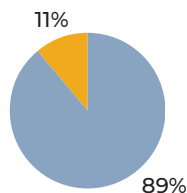


#### DEMOGRAPHICS

### ACADEMICS · ATHLETICS · LEADERSHIP

The Academy's rigorous grade-level requirements are designed to prepare graduates to attend a college or university of their choice. Upon graduation, the majority of seniors are qualified to attend any college or university in the University of California and California State University system. Classes meet as normal Monday through Wednesday, while Thursday and Friday are block schedule days. The Academy has 14 Advanced Placement (AP) courses and 7 Honors or Advanced level courses and a variety of exciting electives.

#### ELECTIVES

The Academy offers electives that are designed to meet the needs and pique the interests of young men, including our renowned Aviation and Computer Science programs.

#### ATHLETICS

All cadets participate in interscholastic athletic teams or physical training throughout the year. The Academy's athletic program offers 12 varsity and 6 junior varsity teams that compete in the California Interscholastic Federation (CIF) San Diego Section. Cadets can also participate club teams including rugby, surfing, and weightlifting.

#### LEADERSHIP

The Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (JROTC) is an accredited program that helps cadets recognize and prioritize their responsibilities in preparation for leadership roles, emphasizing leadership, community service, and citizenship. JROTC provides engaging instruction and pragmatic learning opportunities that benefit the student, community, and nation. This program is an integral part of the Academy's curriculum. All 7th-12th grade cadets take yearly Leadership Education and Training (LET) courses.

## GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

The Academy requires a minimum of 18 credits to graduate. Each represents a year's study in a subject area. Half a credit is awarded for each semester class. All high school cadets take six classes per semester. Below are course requirements for entering ninth graders, which may be modified for cadets entering in grades 10-12:

- 4 years of English
- 4 years of Physical Training or Sports
- 3.5 years of Leadership and Education Training (LET)
- 3 years of Math (4 years recommended)
- 3 years of Social Science
- 2 years of Science (3-4 years recommended)
- 2 years of Foreign Language (3-4 years recommended)
- 1 year of Visual and Performing Arts
- 1 year of College Prep Elective

We assign letter grades using a 4.0 system using the following rubric: A= 90-100%; B= 80-89%; C= 70-79%; D= 60-69%. Advanced Placement and Honors courses are weighted by one point. Grades and credits are assigned in January and June.
