Founded in 1898, Miss Hall's School was one of the first all-girls boarding schools established in New England. Today the School is a nationally recognized, boarding and day independent secondary school that combines an exceptional college-preparatory curriculum with two acclaimed leadership programs, Horizons and the Girls' Leadership Project.





HORIZONS

A ONE-OF-A-KIND PROGRAM



Horizons is Miss Hall's experiential, service-learning and internship program that provides students with opportunities to volunteer and intern each week at local social service and cultural organizations, businesses, and professional offices (such as Pittsfield Community Television, where students master the controls).

Each Thursday, the entire school day changes: ninth grade students immerse themselves in on-campus workshops and projects that prepare them for future Horizons work, build leadership skills, and strengthen connections among them. Sophomores, juniors, and seniors spend the morning volunteering and interning around the Berkshire community or leading on-campus, independent projects that shape the world around them.

"I took the STEAM class with Dr. Himes junior year, and I had a lot of fun! I really enjoyed being able to use my creativity and letting my imagination run wild."


