Graduation Requirements

- **English** - 4 years
- **History & Social Science** - 4 years, including Religious Studies, U.S. History, & Ethics
- **Mathematics** - 3 years, including Algebra II
- **World Language** - 3 years of 1 language or 2 years 2 languages (taken between grades 9-12)
- **Science** - 3 years, including Physics, Chemistry, & Biology
- **Arts** - 1 year
- **Athletics** - 4 years

ADVANCED COURSES

Advanced Courses are designed and taught at the college level, and students must either apply or be recommended for these classes. Advanced Courses allow our faculty and students much greater input and flexibility in the breadth and depth of their studies, as well as the independence to undertake research on topics that may not be covered in depth as determined by the College Board. Students may elect to take AP exams in May, but must prepare independently.

JANUARY TERM

Chatham Hall offers a 2-week January Term between semesters. Students learn important life skills in areas such as personal finance, health, and career development, as well as taking classes aligned with areas of interest.

RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES

Through our Discovery Challenge, iQuest, Hallam Hurt Travel Award programs, and Global Scholars Program, Chatham Hall students may explore a question of importance through experiential learning. These programs often require in-depth research, study, extensive documentation, and sometimes travel. All four programs require students to present their findings to the School community.

A GLOBAL COMMUNITY

GLOBAL ENTREPRENEURSHIP

- Through our two-year program, students explore the fundamentals of economics, management, marketing, and finance while launching real business ventures. Past teams have run a global cuisine food cart, created gourmet horse treats, and founded student-led nonprofits—blending bold ideas with hands-on experience.

GLOBAL SCHOLARS CERTIFICATE

- This three-year program challenges students to develop an international perspective through coursework, travel, and research. It culminates with a capstone thesis and presentation before the School community, preparing students for lives of global leadership.

INNOVATION & MAKERSPACE

- Our Tutu Turtles, Chatham Hall's all-girls robotics team, compete successfully at the state level, showcasing bold thinking in STEM. In the Makerspace, students bring ideas to life using 3-D printers, Cricut cutters, laser printers, resin molds, and more.
- Nationally Recognized Riding Program
- With 30 school-owned horses, our Riding Program blends equestrian excellence with leadership and responsibility. Riders compete in Interscholastic Equestrian Association (IEA) events and national competitions across the East Coast while preparing for collegiate riding.

GLOBAL TRAVEL

- From France and Spain to Cambodia and Kenya, students engage with the world through faculty-led travel, exchange programs, and immersive experiences. Each journey deepens empathy, broadens perspective, and strengthens global citizenship.

TRAILBLAZING MENTORS

- Our Leader in Residence program brings extraordinary women, such as Mary Robinson, Benazir Bhutto, Judith Jamison, Reshma Saujani, and Doris Kearns Goodwin, into our community.
