Founded in 1799 by the Religious Society of Friends, Westtown School continues to be one of the nation's best-known Quaker schools. Situated on 600 acres in Chester County, Pennsylvania, Westtown is accredited by the Pennsylvania Association of Independent Schools.

Students at Westtown are challenged to realize their intellectual, physical, emotional, and spiritual potential. Truth, openness, and honesty are values which undergird the school community. A spirit of inquiry reigns in the classroom, and students are encouraged to think creatively, to feel the condition of others, and to listen to their inner selves.

Through innovative and engaging teaching practices and challenging, intentional, experiential curricula, students are prepared to thrive in a world characterized by technological and social change, equipped with critical thinking, collaboration, and communication skills. They are encouraged and empowered to be confident leaders of a just and compassionate future, to be active and empathetic participants in building healthy communities, and to be stewards of the natural world.

ENROLLMENT -

- Coeducational since the school's founding, Westtown's student body consists of 665 students in grades Pre-K through 12.
- Students come from 20 states and 22 countries.
- The Upper School (grades 9-12) enrolls 358 students (103 day students and 255 boarding).
- 5% are Quakers, 52% are American students of color, and 21% are international students.
- Need-based financial aid is received by 55% of students in the Upper School.
- From the Class of 2024, 92 students enrolled in four-year colleges, two enrolled in international universities, and two did not immediately enroll in college and deferred for a gap year. The Class of 2025 totals 89.

SPECIAL FEATURES OF THE CURRICULUM

Co-Curriculars: Westtown's co-curricular program is rooted in the values of teamwork, collaboration, and creativity. All students must engage in the co-curricular program and participate in activities emphasizing skill-building, communication, creative expression, performance, competition, and individual and community-based growth. Co-curricular activities require students to demonstrate their skills through performance-based activities such as an athletic competition, a theater performance, or an outdoor leadership trip. The variety of co-curricular offerings allows students to select activities aligned with their interests and passions.

Certificate Programs: The Deep Dive Certificate Program challenges students to grow as leaders, to "become the change they want to see," and to lead others in developing a better world. Students may choose to participate in one of six interdisciplinary programs of study: Sustainability Leadership; Diversity, Inclusion, and Social Justice; Global Leadership; Multidisciplinary Arts; and Data-Driven Change. The programs include coursework, research projects, mentorship, experiential learning, and leadership on campus. Students in 10th, 11th, and 12th grades who join this program create a focused, in-depth exploration of an area of passion across a number of subjects.

Work Program: Work Program reaffirms the value of service to others and the dignity of all work. All Upper School students complete a variety of work experiences, including janitorial and kitchen jobs. Students exhibiting excellent leadership skills may also be selected as a captain of a work crew, gaining valuable

experience in leadership and management of a team working toward a common goal.

Independent Research: Students who have completed the full program of study in a department may design an independent study to continue to pursue that subject in greater depth, most often in math, computer science, and world language. Scientific Research (Advanced) is a course that brings together students focused on their own independent, original long-term scientific studies.

Discipline Council: When major school infractions arise, consequences are determined by a panel of students and faculty members. Students serving on the Discipline Council are seen as moral and ethical leaders in the community; this group is committed to understanding discipline as an opportunity for learning and growth. Westtown reports to colleges disciplinary incidents resulting in dismissal or withdrawal. Students are expected to answer colleges' discipline questions honestly, with support from their college counselor.

International Exchange and Service Trips: In addition to living and learning in a dynamic, global community, Westtown offers innovative international programming featuring cross-cultural immersion and service worldwide. These programs reinforce the global competencies we expect of all our graduates. Students lead activities in both classroom and community life, design projects that put their beliefs and understanding of the world into action, and collaborate with others to learn from new cultures.

CURRICULUM

Course levels: All courses are college preparatory. Academic departments identify their most rigorous courses as Advanced. There are 50+ Advanced courses offered; it is impossible to take all of them. A complete description of our curriculum is available in our <u>Curriculum Guide</u>.

Course load: A typical course load for freshmen and sophomores consists of five year-long courses and one or more semester-long courses. The minimum requirement for juniors and seniors is five courses per semester; the maximum is seven. The academic program offers students both breadth and depth of study across the curriculum. The faculty emphasizes the quality of study over quantity, especially in the junior and senior years. Summer courses for credit show the course, credit, and grade on the transcript.

GPA: The GPA is calculated on a 100 point scale at the end of each semester. The cumulative GPA is updated at the end of each school year. Only Westtown credit-bearing classes are included in the GPA. We include all graded courses and do not weigh any class more heavily than another.
