Emma's **Practicum** is a way for students to explore their interests and passions through independent study and experiential learning. Whether you're interested in emergency medicine, teaching literacy, learning how to fence, or creating an advanced series of art works, you will be led through this personalized, hands-on course of study by faculty advisors, mentors, and alumnae.

Emma redefines the concept of expertise, moving from the test-based teachings of Advanced Placement™ courses to our *Advanced Studies* courses. This advanced coursework is both unique to our school and to the depth and breadth of study, which includes coverage of timely or abstract topics within a mastery of traditional subject matter.

Just as your signature is exclusively your own, so is Emma's **Signature**. Our capstone program for juniors and seniors allows for deep exploration of personal passions over two semesters. These students are dedicated to their topic, have an on-campus mentor or off-campus expert as a partner, and also have the time to complete and present an experiential project like Signature.

We are committed to fostering a strong sense of identity and belonging in each student and we believe in the importance of *interest groups*, where students can share ideas and learn more about different cultures and identities.

We believe our students benefit from **affinity groups** that provide a crucial space for students to engage in conversation and provide support for each other around issues that are unique to their specific cultural and societal experiences.

Welcome, ninth graders! Emma's **Ninth Grade Program** is designed to guide students through their pivotal first year academically and socially, to set them on a path to becoming confident, prepared, appreciated, and reflective citizens.

We designed the curriculum for ninth graders with key factors in mind to develop critical and abstract thinking, meaningful relationships with peers, and individual identity.

A Sense of Belonging


