Our heritage as a finishing school

Founded as an international boarding school for girls in 1961, in Leysin by Mrs Georgette-F Andrea, the school started with a small chalet situated above the valley, which inspired the name "Sur-Val". In 1964 Surval moved to Clarens and was run by Ms Andrea's nephew, Mr Sidler until 2010. Surval moved to its new home, previously the Hotel Mont-Fleuri (a building dating back to 1876), in 1998 and continues to thrive in this stunning location.

Surval Montreux enjoyed a long-standing reputation as a successful Swiss Finishing School before becoming a High School in 2001. Surval has remained true to its roots, continuing to offer courses in Etiquette. Our focus remains on preparing students for personal and professional success through the development of lifelong skills and interests.

Our Etiquette and Communications programme develops in girls an awareness of different social norms in varied social and business settings around the world. Being open to the environment about them will enable them to step up to opportunities with confidence. We want a Survalienne to be able to walk into any room with self-assurance, presence and cultural awareness. This remains as relevant now as it did when the school was founded.



Our programmes

At Surval girls enjoy living and studying alongside students following both the High School programme and the French Language & Culture programme. High School and Language & Culture students follow separate academic courses, but join together for the Surval COL programme of electives.





The power of an all-girls education

At Surval Montreux, our role is to educate and empower young women to be proud of who they are and to see themselves the equal to anyone. The mindset instilled through a girls-only education will encourage our students to put themselves forward more confidently.

The power of an all-girls education lies in the fact that:

- Girls take centre stage and are on the front line of leading initiatives;
- All opportunities are for girls in the classroom, science laboratory or art studio, in sports and adventure activities, in assemblies, committees and masterclasses;
- Girls are surrounded by strong female role models providing inspiration to be ambitious for their future;
- Girls are surrounded by a supportive, collaborative environment which gives them space to grow and develop through their teenage years;
- Girls are able to focus on their academic studies and make the most of opportunities free from any perceived barriers;
- Girls are actively called on and encouraged to participate in class and grow confidence to challenge assumptions and voice their opinions.



Sports & Wellbeing

The philosophy of Surval is to ensure that every student can access a physically active lifestyle which supports their overall health and lifelong participation. Throughout the year girls enjoy a dedicated afternoon of sports, in addition to evening and weekend sports opportunities.

During timetabled sports afternoons, girls are taught the importance of healthy lifestyles and physical activity for lifelong participation, enjoying both our internal facilities (tennis court, dance studio, fitness gym and surrounding forest), and external opportunities (water sports, horseriding, golf) to provide a balanced curriculum of sport.

During the winter term the timetabled sports session becomes winter sports (ski or snowboard) visiting local resorts to provide girls with expert tuition from Ecole Suisse de Ski (ESS) Montreux on the slopes.





Challenge, Own, Lead (COL)

The Surval Award

The award covers all aspects of a student's experience at Surval and leads to the Surval Award certificate, with Pass or Distinction. The award is underpinned by an online portfolio completed by each student, in which she records her experiences and reflections, evidencing how she has embraced all aspects of a Surval education and how she has demonstrated Surval's values Challenge, Own and Lead.

The Surval COL curriculum

The Surval COL curriculum draws together all the distinctive elements of Surval's programme which lie beyond the focused academic courses. This features a range of non-academic electives where students have an element of choice to pursue their interests, whilst keeping a balance across physical, creative, linguistic and cultural domains.

The Arts	Fine Art, Photography, Fashion Design, Ceramics, Music, History of Art (Options vary by term and are confirmed according to interest)
Language Enrichment	Additional French conversation, Beginner Italian, Beginner Spanish, home language tuition
Sports and Wellbeing	Autumn and Spring Terms: Tennis, Hiking, Cycling, Running, Horse riding, Sailing, Golf <i>(Options vary)</i> Winter Term: Skiing or Snowboarding
Surval Core	Global Etiquette and Communications for Personal and Professional Success, Careers & University Masterclasses, Life Skills
Passion Project	Putting Challenge, Own, Lead into practice. Identifying a particular interest to research and explore further, guided by a Surval mentor. This may link with a future study/career interest, relate to language studies, involve cultural exploration, or a creative project, or lead to a social enterprise initiative. The focus is on students taking the lead in enhancing their portfolio and exploring an interest individual to them.
Tailored Electives	Additional electives are available according to interest, for example, Psychology, Business and Marketing, preparation for IELTS and SATs.





At Surval, we encourage girls to own their voice. Our students are encouraged to voice their opinions in a responsible and informed manner leading to action with positive impact on the Surval and wider community. We encourage them to find their voice - in the classroom and enrichment activities, in committees, in opportunities for ambassadorship and service.

Student Voices and Committees

Student Voices are a channel for discussing, exploring and taking action.

Girls are encouraged to step up to leadership and to make a contribution to events and activities organised in the school as well as give feedback and make suggestions for future developments. The following Surval Voices are each led by a student ambassador:

A home away from home

Surval is a much-loved home for up to 60 girls. The girls are cared for by our exceptional team of residential staff who are here to support and guide the girls through their Surval experience and support any needs they may have.

The school day is from 8.30am until 3.40pm. Outside these times girls are free to go to their rooms, relax in social spaces, use the gym or other sporting facilities. In the House, girls are supported to manage their time so that they achieve a balance between their studies, leisure and relaxation. At the end of the school day, transport is available to take girls down to Montreux for those who want to enjoy some free time in this beautiful, safe town. In the evening support is readily available with the organisation of homework if needed.

Originally built as a hotel, our beautiful house is full of character and provides a homely environment for the girls. Bedrooms are shared by 2 or 3 girls with a few single rooms available. All bedrooms have a wonderful view of the lake or the mountains and all have personal safes and a fridge. Wi-Fi is available throughout the school.

We enjoy a wide selection of excellent meals for a healthy, balanced diet. Mealtimes are fun and sociable and allow our students to practise their English or French as well as their table manners and social etiquette skills.

We cater for special dietary requirement or food allergies.

Pastoral Care and Wellbeing

Whether a member of the boarding, teaching, house or admin teams, the priority of each member of staff is our students' safety and wellbeing.

The boarding team is there to make them feel at home and cared for day and night. They are also there to support the girls with the demands of living independently.

It is important that we all look after our wellbeing and take steps to lead a healthy lifestyle, including regular physical activity, a balanced diet, healthy sleep patterns and positive frames of mind.

The School Nurse is available in school during the school day Monday to Friday and on call to support the boarding team in the evenings and at weekends. She will make external appointments where needed and will communicate with parents over all medical related matters. Girls will be accompanied to medical appointments by the School Nurse or another member of the Boarding Team.

Each student is allocated a Mentor from within the teaching team. The Mentor is there to provide a bridge across all aspects of the girls' experience at Surval and ensure they feel heard and supported academically, socially and emotionally.
