

Cranbrook's college counseling program supports the school's college preparatory mission through a comprehensive curriculum and individual support for students and families.

- Guided by their advisors, ninth graders begin to develop the skills necessary to make the most of their upper school careers, both in and outside of the classroom.
- As they enter tenth grade, students are paired with their college counselors, who work one-on-one with them through the rest of their upper school years. They also complete a self-paced online series of short exercises that prepares them for the college search and selection process.
- Eleventh graders have the opportunity to meet with the 100+ college admissions representatives who visit Cranbrook each year. They also learn about the college admissions process through a case study program in which they participate as college admissions officers.
- During the summer before twelfth grade, students begin work on their college applications with the guidance of the college counselors, who assist them one-on-one with everything from finalizing their college list to crafting their application essays.


