Since our founding in 1884, Maumee Valley has been a national leader in university preparation and academic innovation. Most recent additions to our campus include a state-of-the-art \$12.5 million high school and residence hall, the Dayal House. A Maumee Valley education is truly an incredible experience.



Maumee Valley is challenging. The best teachers prepare students and balance student experiences through a culture of caring and personal attention. Small class sizes encourage interaction and the advising program, college counseling, ESOL, academic support, and the student life staff ensure your academic and personal success.



Maumee Valley is family. Our student-centered culture affords each student a unique opportunity to form extremely close relationships built on a common experience. In a truly global community, students learn with and among peers from different backgrounds. This provides countless teachable moments and leadership opportunities. Half of the Upper School is multicultural and international students are fully integrated into the life of the school.



Maumee Valley is experiential. Hands-on education is everywhere including classroom projects, collaborative group work, and participation in our signature Intensive program. Beyond academics, almost 100% of students participate in extracurricular activities. Every student is invited to join an athletic team and there are countless clubs to choose from including community service, leadership, ethnic clubs, and academic competitions.



Maumee Valley is community. The residential program is innovative in combining campus living with the exciting elements of a homestay experience. Students have the option to be paired with a "buddy family" and have the opportunity to live with a Maumee Valley family in their Junior or Senior year. These experiences provide a terrific foundation whether students are moving to America or moving away from home for the first time. It is also the best way to prepare for the challenges of academics and life in college.

The Dayal House

Maumee Valley’s boarding program is housed in the \$1.6 million Dayal House. The residence hall was purposefully designed to create a family-like atmosphere for residential students.

From the spacious Commons to the well equipped main kitchen, the Dayal House feels like a home. The Student Life staff includes two American families who forge close relationships with students and guide them in building friendships and developing important social and leadership skills.

Located just across the Anning Lawn from the Upper School, the Dayal House is the place on campus where boarding, international, and day students meet after school to participate in clubs, meet with faculty and staff, or just hang out.

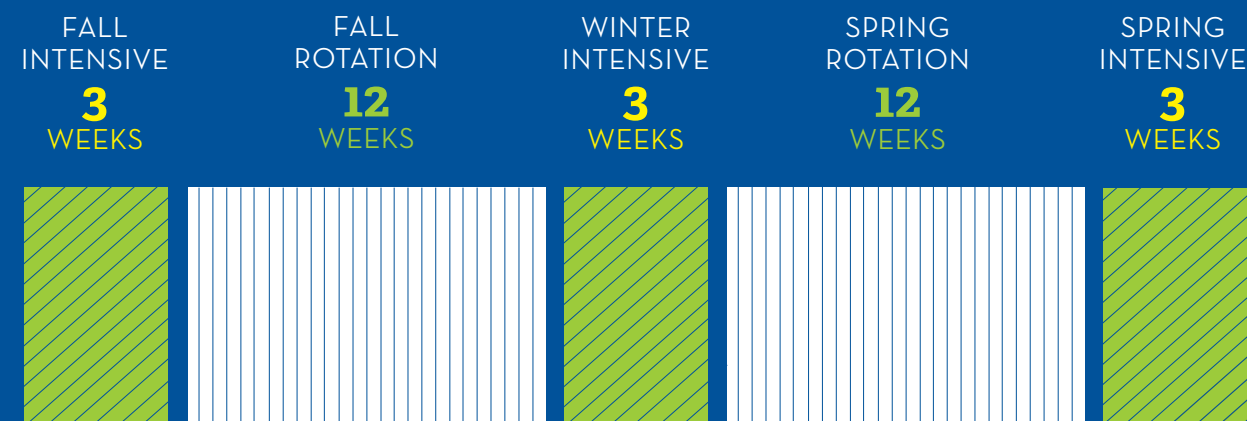
Detroit Metropolitan Airport offers nonstop flights to many cities internationally.

DIVERSE ACADEMIC CHOICES

The Maumee Valley Upper School schedule allows students the opportunity for choice.

Students have 9 weeks each year to select from independent studies or over 30 intensives.

Intensives

Maumee Valley's signature program, Winterim, has been expanded to include three intensive periods of study per year, each lasting three weeks. Each year of a student's Upper School career rotates between a three week intensive and a twelve week rotation.

Intensives enhance the Upper School students' learning by providing in-depth study of a topic and allowing further opportunity to explore personal academic pathways, while earning academic credit.

Students have opportunities to enroll in on-campus courses such as Electrical Engineering, Digital Arts Production, Anatomy and Physiology, Applied Ethics, or the Origins of Technology; travel nationally (Broadway in New York, Adventure Writing in Minnesota) and internationally (Holocaust Studies in Poland, Sustainability in Iceland); and participate in Independent Studies or Internships. Intensives promote connected learning, independence, commitment to personal goals, and professional networking, as students develop a unique portfolio of experiences that make them more competitive in the college admission process.

Highlights of the Upper School

DAYAL CENTER FOR ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Dayal Center for Academic Excellence (DCAE) provides academic support for all Upper School students to help them reach their academic and personal potential.

Individualized assistance is available for students in need of developing skills in time management, organization, note taking, reading comprehension, test preparation, and test anxiety. Emphasis is placed on specific study strategies designed to support each student's learning profile.

ENGLISH TO SPEAKERS OF OTHER LANGUAGES (ESOL) INSTRUCTION

Maumee Valley's ESOL program is designed to support our non-native English speaking students with their academic progress, language transition, and cultural adaptation into American schools, both in and out of the classroom. Features of the program include a multi-level curriculum based upon proficiency and data-driven placement, incorporation of materials from the students' English, Social Studies, and Science classes along with individualized lessons to reinforce their language skills.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE SUMMER PROGRAM

Each summer, Maumee Valley and the Dayal House are home to the premier summer English language immersion program in the region. Students from around the world wanting to develop their language ability join our program, which offers varied levels of English language instruction, exciting hands-on activities, and many cultural experiences. Small class sizes, experienced faculty and staff, and a safe and comfortable learning environment are all features of the summer experience.

HYBRID LEARNING CONSORTIUM (HLC)

The Hybrid Learning Consortium (HLC), founded and directed by The Barstow School, is a collective of independent schools around the world that develop high quality online courses for Upper School students.

The Hybrid Learning Consortium features small classes that allow students and teachers to interact and develop the type of relationship that we value in our on-campus classes.

The HLC offers exciting online course options that can extend and enrich a student's high school experience by complementing and enhancing courses currently offered at Maumee Valley.

GLOBAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

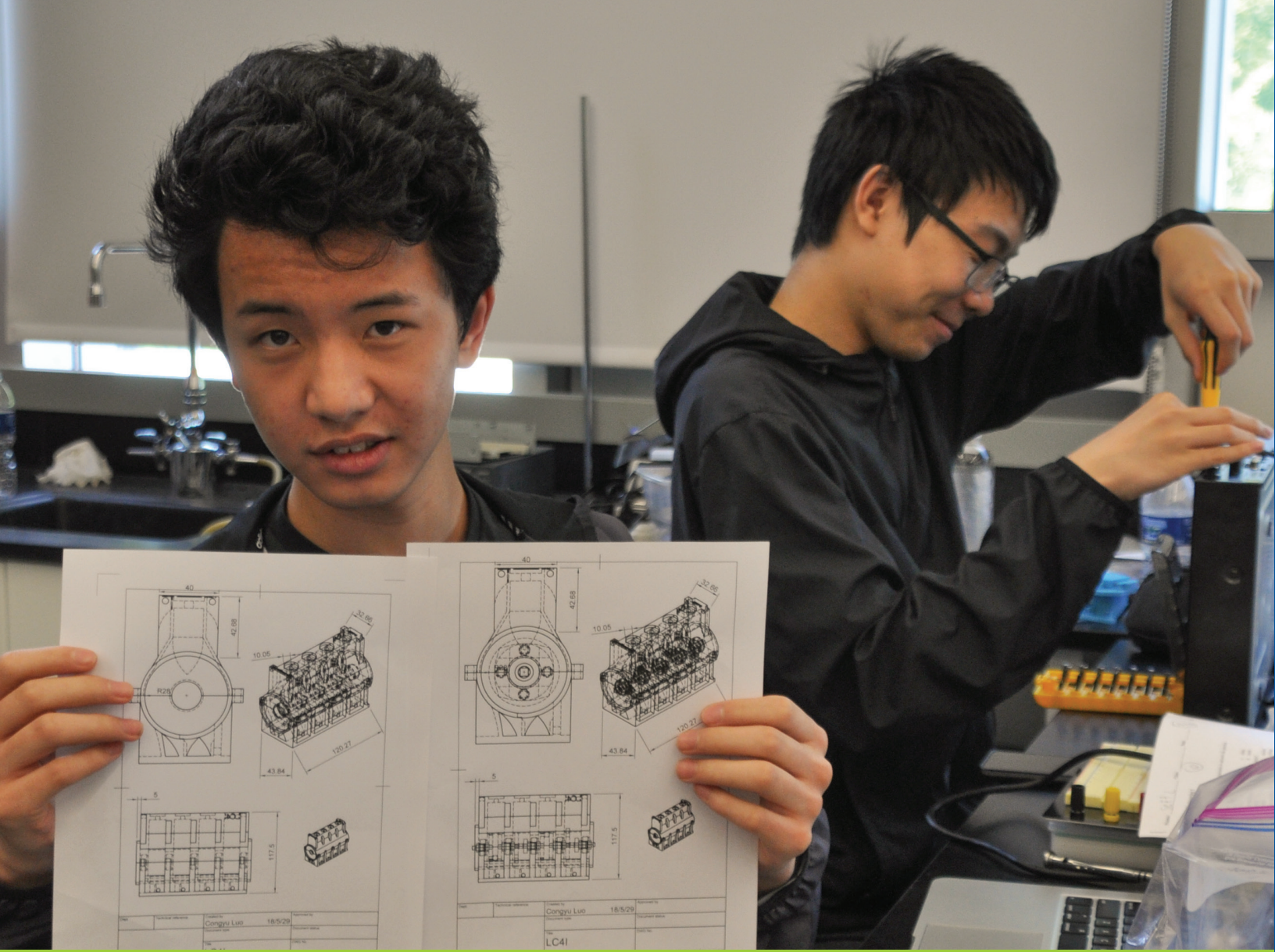

Led by students, the Global Leadership Program provides numerous opportunities for the Upper School to engage with global issues. Committees of students connect with nationally recognized speakers, implement service programs, and manage the Global Scholar Certificate. Global Scholars are recognized with a special diploma at graduation based on their commitment to world language, international travel, community service, and Global Leadership Program events.

EXCELLENCE IN THE ARTS

Maumee Valley students are excellent communicators, and the voice of every student is nurtured through the arts. From theatre to string ensemble, and choir to the visual arts, students have endless opportunities to explore their creative passions. Students are not passive observers but makers of music, sound, paintings, sculpture, photography, and drama.

Music instruction is a hallmark of Maumee Valley's fine arts education. Programs include choirs, string ensembles, jazz ensemble, and private lessons.



ADVANCED PLACEMENT mvcds.org/ap

Selected 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students engage in college-level coursework through the College Board's Advanced Placement (AP) program. The school offers 14 AP courses spread over 6 separate disciplines. Last May, 99 MVCDS students wrote 211 AP Exams. Of these exams 46% were scored at a level of 4 or 5, and 73% of these exams were scored at a level of 3 or better (passing and eligible for college credit). Because of their success on these nationally administered exams, 30 MVCDS students were designated as AP Scholars, 5 as AP Scholars with Honors, 11 as AP Scholars of Distinction, and 1 as an AP National Scholar.

ADVISORY

Faculty advisors provide wisdom and support in all areas of school life. Daily check-ins, twice weekly meetings, and monthly updates to families connect advisors, students, and their parents.

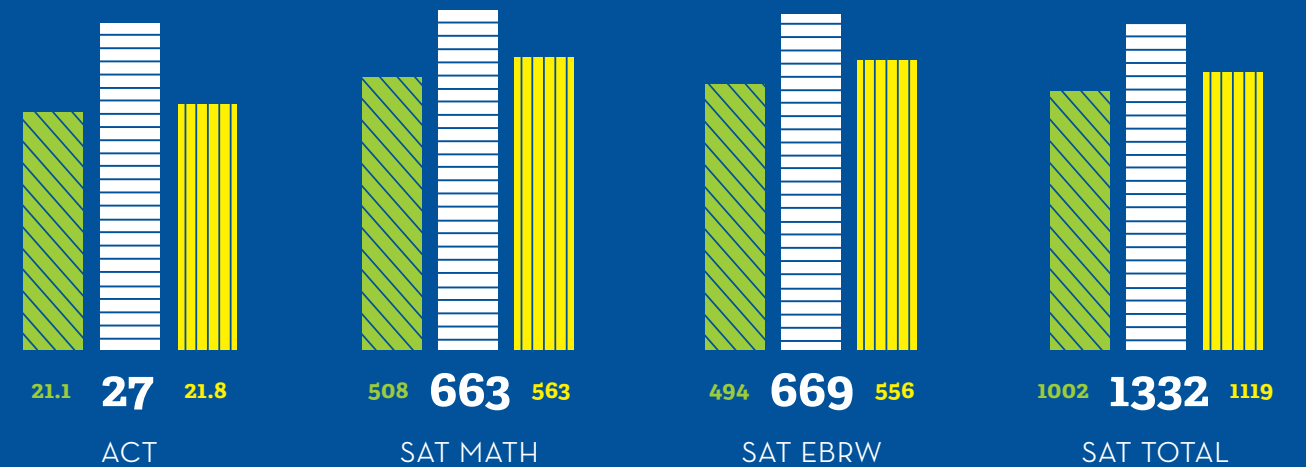
Advisory time allows students to address their social and emotional learning. Within their group, students have the opportunity to explore topics including: healthy relationships, personal identity, ethical decision-making, and equity and diversity.

Additionally, advisors work with students and their parents to help them engage in courses, activities, and independent studies that meet the needs and passion of each student.

INDIVIDUAL COUNSELING

Families work one-on-one with the College Counselor through all phases of the process. Students and parents have five individual meetings with the Director.

COLLEGE VISITS

Spring Break college tours are led by the College Counseling Office. On these trips, students explore the different types of colleges and universities — gaining an understanding not only of specific institutions but of the different structures, programs, teaching, and learning methodologies available at college or university.

APPLICATION PREPARATION

Juniors work through a series of activities designed by the College Counseling Office that thoughtfully move them toward polished essays, completion of the Common Application, and a thorough and diverse list of colleges and universities they will consider.
