Habits of Mind

The Habits of Mind are a repertoire of behaviors that help students successfully navigate the challenges they encounter in the classroom. We seek to develop these behaviors through project-based and experiential learning. The Habits of Mind are: **Preparation, Participation, Curiosity, Organization, Self-Advocacy, and Perseverance**. With the Habits of Mind as the framework of methodology, the Casimir Seminar and Humanities are two unique programs that are part of the Ninth Grade Experience at Marianapolis.

Ninth Grade Experience

Humanities is a cross-curricular course that blends history, English, theology, and art themes, as well as applications of critical thinking. Humanities is taught and moderated by three teachers in each discipline of English, history, and theology. The **Casimir Seminar** is a semester-long course that is designed to provide a foundation of essential skills and insights that will benefit first-year students and enhance their ability to achieve success in their academic and extracurricular careers while at Marianapolis.



Centers of Excellence

The Centers of Excellence (COE) is a specialized diploma program that allows students to self-select into one of three centers: Civic Engagement & Service, Business & Entrepreneurship, and Innovation. Distinctive features of the COE program include: completion of specific academic curricula for each center, completion of a supervised internship, participation in the COE seminar, participation in an appropriate LEAP Week course, and completion of a capstone project during the senior year. The Centers aim to enhance a student's traditional education, while allowing them to become globally engaged in a specific focal area with practical, real-world experience. Through these experiences, students will have a greater understanding of potential career goals and aspirations.

Civic Engagement & Service students will learn to analyze civic concepts such as order, sovereignty, authority, principle, common good, freedom, responsibility, service, individual rights, and participation to become more informed, discerning, engaged, and active citizens within their communities.

Business & Entrepreneurship students will learn the interpersonal, analytical, collaborative, and leadership skills to help ensure productivity in the world of business.

Innovation students will learn engineering, information technology,

medicine, and science to introduce new methodologies for meeting global challenges.

Academic Resource Advisor

The Academic Resource Advisor is available to students with demonstrated learning needs and assists them in navigating and coordinating the academic resources at Marianapolis. The Advisor supports student development of executive functioning skills, including time management, organization, and self-advocacy. One tool that develops and reinforces these skills is Canvas, our online learning management system. The Academic Resource Advisor is available to meet with students individually, with their advisor, with their parents, or in small groups.

LEAP Week

LEAP Week is a one-week mini-term where small groups of students explore a specific topic, project, or adventure. Students might find themselves on a simulated mission in Mars at NASA's Space Camp, getting

their SCUBA certification in Florida, planting mangrove saplings in Thailand, or learning how to film and edit a news package at the New York Film Academy's Broadcast Journalism School. Students have the opportunity to explore a different part of the United States or immerse themselves in a new activity such as movie making, food blogging, or interior design. With over 20 course offerings in various fields of study, students have multiple options to explore their interests. LEAP Week courses are offered in The Arts, Core Study, Personal Challenge, Mission, and Cultural Immersion areas.

Experiential Learning

The Experiential Learning (EL) Program is an exciting opportunity for students to continue learning outside of the classroom. EL trips take place throughout the school year, typically on Sundays. Students will travel all around New England, learning things such as paddle boarding, surfing, glass blowing, welding, and much more.

Every year, Marianapolis students have the chance to take their education abroad during the March spring break. Past trips have included Spain, Japan, Thailand, Italy, Germany, Austria, and Switzerland. This year students will have the opportunity to visit Peru, Portugal, and Australia.
