ACADEMIC RESOURCES & FACILITIES


Take advantage of the best in education!

Chemistry Lab

The Chemistry lab at Saint Thomas Aquinas is where real-world problems are solved through student application of core chemistry concepts. The modern technology used in this classroom fosters learning and exploration in chemistry students of all levels.




Science Program

The Science Program at Saint Thomas Aquinas is developed to provide exceptional experience-based learning and a wide variety of electives to explore new fields. The program, which is being revamped and expanded for the 2018/19 school year, offers 4 APs, 6 Honors classes, and unique electives such as Marine Biology, Forensics, and Advanced Genetics and Biotechnology.


Digital Arts Program

At Saint Thomas Aquinas, students are able to meld technology and art to create an advanced learning experience by taking courses in the Digital Arts such as Photography and Photoshop and Graphic Design and Drawing. 2D and 3D Modeling classes blend traditional studio arts with computer-based design. Students are also able to take the new Introduction to Digital and Fine Arts, and additional technology-based art courses and design-based technology courses are in development.



3D Printer

The 3D printer is used to encourage design and innovation across all disciplines. From making parts for a robot to creating art pieces, students are able to bring their visions into the 3D world using state-of-the-art computer technology. New for 2018/19, students can take a 3D Modeling and Design Fine Arts course.



Independent Study Program

By participating in an Independent Study, students add onto their portfolio and enhance their college resume. Students bring their ideas within certain subjects to life with the help of a faculty mentor. In 2017, students built their own Tesla Coil, which they demonstrated to other local schools.



Smartboards

All classrooms are fitted with a Smartboard that integrates technology into the lesson and allows for interactive instruction.



College Counseling Services

Beginning their freshman year, each student is assigned a guidance counselor who assists them with every step of the college admissions process. The counselors help students with the college search, applying, and decision making. They also facilitate PSAT, SAT, and ACT testing.



Study Travel Opportunities

During Winter Term, between the fall and spring semesters, students have the opportunity to travel to a new place or learn a new skill. Sample sessions include Scuba Diving in the Bahamas, completing an Internship with Timberland, or growing your musical skills in a Guitar Building course.



MATH TEAM

The Math Team competes monthly against seven other schools in the local area. The students' knowledge is tested in five different categories ranging from Algebra I to Advanced Senior Math. The team competed at the state level against 50 other schools and was awarded second place in 2018!

Step 1. Gather Required Documents

- English language test result (IELTS, TOEFL, or SLATE)
- Copy of Passport
- Any additional supporting documents

Step 3. Interview

A Skype interview is required for ALL students in order to assess oral language ability and student character.



Step 4. Confirming Your Place

If the applicant is accepted, the \$2,800 enrollment deposit, host family application, and terms and conditions must be submitted according to the deadlines provided on our website: utphighschools.com

Once the \$2,800 enrollment deposit has been received, the I-20 (student visa form) is issued. The applicant will be required to submit their medical history & immunization information after successfully receiving a student visa.

ACCEPTED

If the applicant successfully passes the visa interview, flight details, and full payment will be due before the student's arrival to the program.

Host Family details will be provided 2 weeks before student's arrival to the program.

DENIED

If the applicant's visa application is denied, please return the original I-20 to UTP International Admissions with the visa denial letter by post for a refund.

Please note that students are required by State law to submit a medical history BEFORE arriving to the program. Additionally, in no case can a student arrive to the program without a PPD (tuberculin test) or negative Chest X-ray.
