ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The curriculum consists of rigorous college-preparatory academics in all subject areas. All graded courses not designated as Advanced Placement (AP) or Distinguished Scholar (DS) are taught at the Honors level.

- Saint Mary's School does not calculate class rank
- 21 AP courses offered in the 2024-2025 academic year
- 6 Distinguished Scholars courses, including post-AP Multivariable Calculus, taught at a level comparable to AP
- A copy of the Curriculum Guide, including course offerings by department, is available online
- Students enrolled in AP courses are typically required to take the AP Exam
- The school year is divided into semesters, and the expected course load is seven courses per semester, including Seminar
- Diploma requirements include a minimum of 22 units full graduation requirements can be found online

COURSE OFFERINGS AND GRADING

Saint Mary's offers courses at three levels: Honors, Advanced Placement, and Distinguished Scholars. Students are encouraged to select classes that enhance their learning, complement their learning styles, an allow for a positive, balanced school experience. Final course placements are determined by the academic affairs team in consultation with teachers and advisors.

DISTINGUISHED SCHOLARS - NEW COURSE OFFERINGS BEGINNING 2024-2025

Saint Mary's developed the Distinguished Scholars (DS) courses to provide an increased variety of courses for our students outside the AP curriculum, while maintaining a similar standard of rigor, workload, and academic depth. DS courses are built on the foundation of the 10 key competencies, and put students at the center of their own learning through a focus on interdisciplinary and experiential education. DS courses offered in the 24-25 academic vear include:

Media Studies, Dance of Death, Modern Art History,
Music and the Science of Sound, Multivariable Calculus, Environmental Engineering

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

SEMINAR:

A required, annual course for all students, teamtaught by faculty, and designed to develop the 10 key competencies through intentional partnerships with outside organizations. In second semester of senior year, students complete a senior capstone or internship for an in depth study or experience on a chosen topic. Recent graduates have completed internships or conducted research in fields including medicine, elementary education, marketing, collegiate athletics, real estate, historical preservation, the fashion industry, and law.

PROJECT LEAD THE WAY:

Saint Mary's is proud to offer three of the courses in the Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Biological Science sequence. By immersing students in activities like practicing suturing and constructing body structures from clay, PLTW Biomedical Science empowers students to build knowledge and skills in biomedical science, as well as indemand, transportable skills like problem solving, critical and creative thinking, communication, and collaboration. Students are eligible to apply for college credit upon completion of individual courses or the full sequence of PLTW Biomedical

YOUNG WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE:


The Young Women's Leadership Institute (YWLI) is a dynamic and transformative two-week summer camp for high school-aged girls, designed to inspire and equip young women with the skills, knowledge, and confidence needed to become leaders in their communities and beyond. Students follow a university-developed leadership curriculum, and learn directly from profoundly successful women leaders through a daily speaker series. Past speakers have included a Broadway star, a world-renown cave diver and explorer, a former NASA astronaut, award-winning journalists, leaders in academia, and champion athletes.

GLOBAL STUDIES:

The Saint Mary's School educational travel program is designed to provide students with experiential opportunities that build empathy and compassion for others. Trips are offered throughout the academic year and during the summer. Recent Saint Mary's trips have included study or service in Iceland, France, England, and the Dominican Republic. Saint Mary's also participates in an annual exchange program with Institution des Chartreux in France and Saint Mary's School in Australia.

COLLEGE & UNIVERSITY MATRICULATION

The 85 members of the Class of 2024 were admitted to 151 institutions across the United States and abroad. Those recent graduates enrolled at 53 different colleges in 20 states, DC, England, and Spain, with 68% enrolled at institutions outside of North Carolina.
